A personal note...

Active Obedience



Last year I remember asking one of our young people, as they stood in the water fully clothed ready to be baptised, why they were getting baptised today. He responded, "because God told me to!" That's active obedience.

This week I heard of a person who gave up an hour on Tuesday night to go pray with others for the nation of Philippines. Why? - Because Gods told him to. That's active obedience.

When we respond immediately to the Holy Spirits prompting and His convictions that's active obedience and there is MUCH fruit when we do.

What about when we don't respond?

Last year while installing equipment in the back hall a hole needed to be drilled in the external wall. The hole was never filled even though a person had many promptings to fill the hole. Now we have to repair the damage from rain that came in.

Last year I visited the church toilets many times and noticed one toilet and one urinal constantly dripping. I must fix that I thought. Months past

with many promptings and it took the cost of an excess water bill to get the job done. Both instances cost us money. We can live with that, but what happens when that cost is lives? What happens when the cost is our destiny or others destiny? Whenever we fail to immediately obey the Holy Spirits promptings and convictions there is a cost and the cost is always more serious than lost money. It doesn't matter if we fix the problem or

make amends down the track the opportunity to act is gone.

Every time we ignore or fail to act on the Holy Spirits promptings there is a cost involved. Every time we dismiss, or put off the Holy Spirits promptings it gets a little easier to ignore until eventually we don't even hear Him anymore.

Jesus has set us an example to follow,

"Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased. Then I said, 'Here I am—it is written about me in the scroll— I have come to do your will, O God.'" Heb 10:5-7 (Ps 40:6-8)

Now is the time to act to the Holy Spirits promptings. Will you be obedient!

During the last couple of weeks my heart has been continually breaking because of the devastation of the fires throughout Victoria. These fires have destroyed many lives and towns – some towns losing 20% or more of their population not to mention homes and animals. They have brought the whole of Australia and even people from overseas to their knees, to dig deep financially and spiritually to overcome what has been lost.



As I've been thinking of this I've been hearing a different kind of story but hopefully you will see the connection as I have done. I have been hearing stories of kids within Cairns who are seeking advice from our own kids within this community. I heard of one boy who would like to follow Jesus but is too afraid because of the ridicule or rejection he may face from his own parents and family. I have heard of another who doesn't know what to believe asking one of our Centenary Lakes young people "What should I believe? Why?" I have heard of ladies asking "Who is Jesus?" I'm sure this is going on all over Cairns within all schools, across work places, mothers groups, sporting groups etc, but what are we doing about it? People are dying all over Cairns – all over the world and they have no hope of eternal life – but what are we doing about it? Are we building community here to get together to fight a spiritual battle that is raging around our kids, around our nation and all over the world?

I believe when people rally together with one purpose and one desire – that builds community!!**

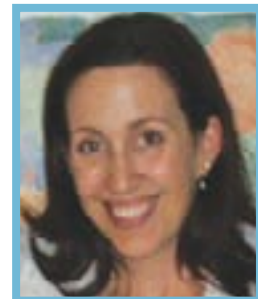
How do we build community here at Centenary Lakes – by getting together with one purpose and one desire – to be Christ to hurting people - to equip one another and to battle together in prayer.

Prayer for the Nations ...

Afghanistan



Because Afghans have experienced so much death and destruction over decades, life has become very cheap. Parents desperately want to see their children grow into adulthood, but childhood death is so prevalent that daily life hardly slows when a child dies.

Flags flutter over graves of men and boys killed in battle along roadsides and in villages. Mothers stand “beside their graves with one foot in this world, the other in the next” during childbirth. If there are complications in childbirth, medical help is often hours if not days away.

In some

parts of the country there are women more likely to die in childbirth than live to hold their babies.

Because they are well acquainted with death, Afghans have a strong belief in fatalism – the idea that death is assigned and nothing can be done to prevent it. Fatalism spans many religions, including Islam.

Pray...

For an understanding that our days are indeed numbered, but by a loving God, and that He, the source of all good and health, will

provide what is needed for those days.

That Afghans will have dreams and visions of the Savior in times of illness or mental distress, and that a believer will be positioned nearby to help interpret them.

I'm being challenged. I may feel like I'm talking to the ceiling, but I need to persevere.

And I'm being challenged. There is nothing that is more important than spending time with the Creator God, and allowing him to work through me to change the world.

The words of this song have been in my mind alot recently, & I have found myself changing them sometimes, to "If this should be my last day in *this land*, how then shall I live?" I'm sure you have seen in the news of things that have occurred in this land over recent months, things that have made us reassess how we live here, how we go about reaching our aim of sharing hope with those around us.

Many of the events that have occurred still seem quite surreal to me as they were not in my town, but I know the reality of them by seeing the workers who are choosing to leave as a consequence, & we have chosen to increase our security measures, so I'm currently feeling the lack of freedom in my movements, but at the same time seeing the wisdom behind such choices.

As I have thought over the issue of death & I guess in a sense the close proximity we all live to it - to this being our last day to live & serve our Father - I am reminded of the urgency of spreading our message of hope, & following Peter's encouragement to: "Through thick and thin, keep your hearts at attention, in adoration before Christ, your Master. Be ready to speak up and tell anyone who asks why you're living the way you are, and always with the utmost courtesy." 1 Peter 3:15 (The Message) And for me here, to not even wait for the invitation to share why I live the way I do...but to seek out such opportunities. (Are you?)

The lack of hope, especially in the face of death, became more apparent to me this last week as I found myself amongst a group of women mourning the death of the mother of one of our drivers.

son, & the provision of a substitute - the ram.

As I visit with friends who celebrate at this time, please ask with me that I'll be able to share with them of the s*crifice of the LAMB & the eternal life that is available to them through our S*viour, & that they in turn will join me in celebrating His birth!

Once again, thanks for being a part of my life, I value you so much!

The period of mourning goes on for a number of days here, with women visiting to mourn with the family on the third day. We proceeded into a room, & were followed by a number of women with white head coverings, one (I think a local religious woman) who pr*yed & chanted from their local r*lig**us book, whilst the other women wailed quietly.

Once she was finished, relatives of the woman who died began to wail & mourn loudly, calling her name & asking why she had gone, asking her to come back. I glanced up at this time through near tear-filled eyes from the pain & agony in the room (some real from those close to her, & some because it is expected) to see women holding white hankies to their eyes, others with tears streaming down their faces.

One thing I did not see anywhere...hope.

Assurance of eternity is an unknown thing...will they meet their loved ones again...it's all in the hands of their g*d - as he wills. It was a sad, sobering & heart-breaking moment for me as I gained a deeper glimpse into the pain & turmoil of my friends lives...without hope.

Over the past weeks I've also been privileged to experience the joy of new life, as many friends have had babies over the past months & I've been able to celebrate with them. In this culture, sons are more highly valued then daughters, so it was so lovely to hear a man who has worked for me for 3 years happily tell me he was the father of a little girl, & that she was a gift from G*d!!

Merry Christmas & peace be with you as you celebrate Him this season!
