Suffering in Burma

Early in June MIG (Missions Interest Group) was able to donate \$1200 to Christian Solidarity to be used in whatever way was most needed. This was because of the generosity of you our church. That same day

by the Burmese that unconditional surrender is their only option, and also that they can go and join with the 'Peace Council' (run by a breakaway faction, and a proxy for the Burmese army) and live in that area - although

On Thursday night June 8th the Burmese attacked the little Karen School near Methrie, N. of Ler Per her which was run by Pastor Saw Parmor. An American volunteer teacher escaped, two soldiers were killed and some children are missing. The Anglican School at No Bo, which is on the Thai side of the river border has been evacuated for safety reasons.

the recognised area has not been extended and it is not big enough for this number of people.

The DKBA (Aproxy army for the Burmese) has been 'given' areas previously occupied by the KNU and are required to attack as directed by the Burmese. A report says "that the DKBA is accepting to become border police, or soldiers, and will try and occupy the whole border areas and get rid of the KNLA". (Karen National Liberation Army)

All this is happening in continuous heavy rain and one report describes it all as "really terrible".

A call comes from Pastor Dr Simon director of the

I (Martin) received word of the following atrocities occurring in Burma – WOW, how good is our God and what fantastic timing. I want to say thank you to you, Centenary Lakes, for your generous hearts and please read the following for your information and so you can be praying for our brothers & sisters in Burma. The Burmese Army has since June 6th commenced an offensive in a number of Karen areas. It is claimed that the KNU (Karen National Union) have been told

One of the concentrated attacks was in the area of the Ler Per Her IDP Camp. As the fighting closed in on the village women, children and the elderly moved from Ler Per Her to a temporary camp over the border in Thailand. In the last couple of days (June 6-8) the village (IDP camp) has been shelled and has had to be evacuated. Camp leaders who pledged to stay to fast and pray for deliverence remain in the area. 2435 people in all were evacuated from Ler Per Her.

Biblical Discernment: How do we tell truth from error?

This morning I was sitting at my work desk and couldn't get comfortable. Something just wasn't right. Something was niggling away and had me shifting in my seat, I couldn't sort it out. Finally, I stood up and realised I had my car keys in my back pocket...

Pain is the body's way of letting us know that something isn't right. It's an uncomfortable feeling that hopefully makes us stop and think and investigate before we continue whatever it is we are doing. We know when something isn't right because we aren't usually in pain so its easy to recognise something isn't "normal". Hopefully...

If you point these things out to the brothers, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, nourished by the words of the faith and of the good teaching that you have followed. But have nothing to do with irreverent and silly myths.

Rather, train yourself in godliness – 1 Timothy 4.6-7

Here Paul makes it absolutely clear to Timothy to be discerning and men his words need to be heard just as clearly by us. Discernment is the skill of separating truth from error. Paul urges Timothy to continue in the truths of the faith and the teaching which he has received. Why? So that he would know the difference between truth and error and have nothing to do with myths and godless ideas, or philosophies of the world. These things were creeping into the church and Paul wanted Timothy to be equipped to contend for the faith and teach others the same. He hammered Titus with the same message too (Titus 1.9).

Men if we don't know the truth of God's Word from scripture, if our "house" isn't built on the rock – we will be "like a child tossed by the waves and blown

around by every wind of teaching" (Ephesians 4.14). When scriptural misinterpretations and flaky doctrines are presented to us we wont know any different – wont feel uncomfortable - unless the foundational teachings of our faith are in order.

Now just because you are uncomfortable about something doesn't always mean it's wrong – we can only measure what's right and true when we line it up with scripture. Scripture is a "light on our path" (Psalm 119.105) it "corrects us and trains us" (2 Tim 3.16). Luke commended the men of Berea not for being 'noddys' – simply nodding 'yes' in agreement, but because they "examined the scriptures" to confirm the truth of the teaching they were hearing from Paul and Silas (Acts 17.11).

Some of us can be incredibly discerning when making our footy tips each week, or when deciding

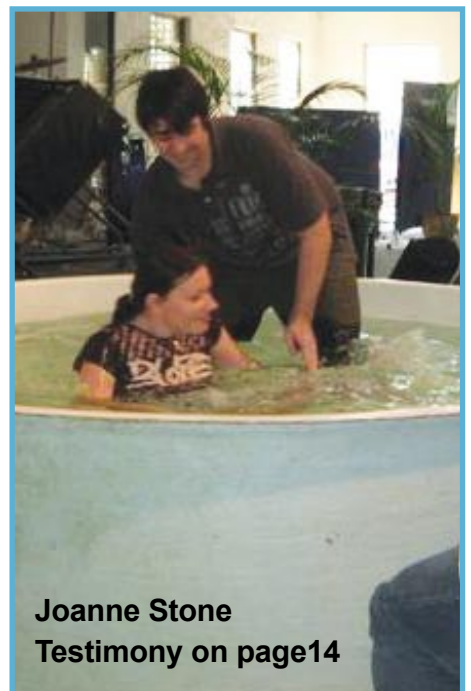
