Holiness Highway

And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness.

Isaiah 35:8

As you may know each Tuesday morning I meet with other Christian leaders to pray for our churches and city. This past Tuesday one of the leaders shared with me how for the last few weeks when he prayed for me he saw a road being built. At the moment the road was only dirt and full of rocks and rubbish, but bit-by-bit people joined in and a highway was being built.

I was excited and encouraged by his words as they confirmed where I believe God has been leading us as a church.

The prophet Isaiah makes many references to highways being built (35:8; 40:3; 49:11; 62:10)

“Walk out of the gates. Get going! Get the road ready for the people. Build the highway. Get at it! Clear the debris, hoist high a flag, a signal to all peoples! Yes! God has broadcast to all the world: “Tell daughter Zion, ‘Look! Your Saviour comes, Ready to do what he said he’d do, prepared to complete what he promised.’ ”

Isaiah 62:10-12

Highway building is about preparation. John the Baptist had this call on his life. He was to prepare the way for people to receive the one who would come after him – “The Saviour.” God is still looking for a people who will prepare the way for a generation to receive “The Saviour.”

God is looking for a church that will prepare the way, make straight the path and remove the rocks so the next generation will not stumble and fall. He’s looking for a church that will face their own sins and brokenness and deal with them in a Godly way so the next generation is standing on higher ground. He’s looking for a church that will totally consecrate themselves to Him - a church that will seek God, listen to God, and obey God. It's all about

Mens' Ministry

John Smith Breakfast

Saturday May 17th John Smith met with 41 men from church for breakfast at The Tradewinds resort on the Esplanade. The men enjoyed a start to the day with mates and plenty of good food - from bacon, tomato and eggs to fruit and muesli which Jim Nissen appropriately dubbed bird food!

After breakfast John shared with us for over an hour - challenging us to think about our words and actions from a Godly perspective. John's not afraid of addressing the actions from other Christians when he sees it contradicting Gods Word and some of his comments still continue to be discussed by our men as they meet. What has encouraged me has been hearing of men going into God's Word to get understanding on issues.

One phrase he said which has remained with me is "Who you are depends on who you know you belong to." I know I belong to Christ and want to live a life pleasing Him not man, to live life before an audience of one, the Lord Jesus Christ.

The most impacting lesson I learned as a young Christian man was the importance of knowing scripture. It's not good enough to have a vague knowledge of God's Word to live a life of purpose for Jesus Christ. The Bible itself makes clear the need for us to know scripture thoroughly and intimately.

1. It equips us against Sin:

Psalm 119:9,11 "How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to your word. I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you."

Having God's Word in our heart and mind enables the Holy Spirit to remind us of the call to live pure and holy lives and challenges our choices in demanding moments.

2. It equips us for Evangelism:

Romans 1:16 "I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of Christ for the salvation of everyone who believes." The Holy Spirit uses the Word of God to change lives. How can we communicate the good news of Jesus Christ to people who don't understand it if we don't know it well enough to tell it God's way?

3. It equips us to Lead:

2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for

teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." God challenges us to lead a life of discernment – discerning truth from error and taking action. The USA treasury staff learn to discern counterfeit bank notes by knowing in incredible detail the features of their genuine dollar notes. If we are to lead others for God we need to lead them in His truth.

4. It equips us for Fellowship:

Colossians 3:16-17 "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly....."

If God's Word is the dominant influence on our life, we are better equipped to impact the lives of fellow Christians because we know His truth and purposes. There are more benefits than I have space for here! I encourage and challenge you to memorise God's Word. Pray and select a passage, which will give you strength then choose a key verse. Write it on a card and learn it for a week, then have someone test you on it word for word. When that one's done – learn another then another. Like any good student review your learning to let it go deep into your heart and change your life.

A note on our

Prayer Corner

This month I have written some more for families. For those with young children, here's a question? What are we teaching our kids about prayer? Are we teaching them that -

- 1) Prayer's a last resort – Do we try everything else before God? Perhaps it doesn't cross our minds to pray (until we're really desperate) or we don't think God wants to be bothered with the every day stuff.
- 2) Prayer's a ritual – There is nothing wrong with meal time graces and set bed time prayers, but if they are the only type of prayer that our children see modelled, then they learn that prayer is just a pattern of repeated words at set times.
- 3) Prayer's a conversation - Is prayer instinctive, like chatting with a friend? Do our children see that we believe that our heavenly Father is someone who loves us and cares about every little thing that concerns us?
- 4) Prayer really changes things – Do we expect answers to our prayers? Do our children learn from us that prayer is powerful and effective?



Here are some ideas to help us be the prayer role models that our children need us to be -

- 1) Read the Bible every day (even for a couple of minutes).
- 2) Pray. On the go is fine. Chat with God while you do the dishes or walk the dog.
- 3) Look for opportunities to show that God cares. When something is lost, your child is hurt, having a tough time at school, or has had a nightmare, stop and out loud ask God for help.

4) Look for opportunities to show your children that it is God who gives us everything. Say thanks to God before meals and don't just give thanks for the food, think of other ways that God meets our needs and thank Him for those things too.

5) Find opportunities to show them that no matter how things look, God's in control in the world. When negative news items are on TV, the internet or in the newspaper, pray for God to intervene to bring peace and healing into the lives of those who are suffering.

6) Take opportunities to show your children that it is God who made the universe and everything in it. Look at a beautiful sunset or a tiny insect and say thanks out loud to God for His wonderful creation.

Burma

Update & prayer points from
Martin Panter CSW

Whilst the world waits and watches, holds discussions and meetings, thousands, maybe tens of thousands are needlessly dying in S. Burma. What started as a natural disaster has now become a calculated mass slaughter of the innocents, by a regime that is more concerned with holding on to power than it is for the life of its citizens. After the terrible genocide in Rwanda the cry of the International community was 'never again'.

Never will we stand by and watch a preventable genocide taking place. But that is exactly what is unfolding right now in Burma. As each day passes thousands more die of hunger, thirst, and preventable diarrhoeal diseases. Whilst offshore in ships of the American and British navies, and in warehouses in Thailand, Bangladesh and Dubai, supplies and medicines remain on hold, all awaiting delivery.

What can we do? We can pray and we can act. Let us storm the gates of heaven on behalf of our brothers and sisters in Burma. Those in the Irawaddy Delta, the area worst effected by the cyclone, which the Junta have sealed off from any aid deliveries, the inhabitants are mainly Karen Christians. This in itself gives a sinister twist to the

Junta's deliberate withholding of aid. Let's contact our MP's, and write or email the Foreign Minister Steven Smith with our legitimate concerns. The writer to the Hebrews in ch 13 vs 1-2 reminds us to "Remember those in bonds, as though we were actually there with them" i.e. a close identification with their suffering. Can we do that as a church, and believe for God to act sovereignly in response?

Thank you on behalf of all those who suffer in Burma right now.

China

Update & prayer points from
Sharlee Young (Global Interaction)

I'm writing to you with a heavy heart, trusting that you have heard of the devastating earthquake near Chengdu in Sichuan province last Monday. The enormous damage to life and property has been overwhelming as we experienced the largest earthquake since the establishment of PRC. The minor earthquakes have been recorded for 192 times up to 6.2 degree last night, and will still be continuing in the next few months. Thanks for those concerned emails. I just returned safely from a long trip to China. I was originally planning to teach in a city only 50km from the epicentre of the earthquake on the very day of the earthquake. I was going to fly to Chengdu in the morning and then take a 4

hour bus to that city - the arrival hour was just about the time of earthquake. Praise the Lord's protection. Please pray: for those who have lost family & friends; for the rescue and medical teams; the government; the rebuilding of many broken lives that will take years. Would you join me in prayer during these devastating hours of the nation?

Zimbabwe

Pray for Peace - Pray for the country of Zimbabwe. Pray for an end to the suffering of its people. Pray for a stop to the violence. Pray that the church and human rights organisations within the country would have the strength to continue to stand and declare to the world what is happening. And pray that the international community, including the United Nations, would have the courage and the compassion to take action to put an end to the suffering. Pray for a fair run-off election - Morgan Tsvangirai, the opposition leader has now returned to Zimbabwe after a six week absence, to campaign in the run-off election to be held on 27 June 2008. Pray for his physical protection. Pray that President Mugabe's regime would allow independent observers and peacekeepers into the country well before the election to ensure that the election is conducted fairly and transparently.

Michelle Arthur has spent a few weeks in Pietermaritzburg, South Africa. She has taught children a song at their school assembly, visited a rural village crèche, planted seedlings in a community garden, sorted baby clothes for a 'Pregnancy Crisis Centre', and painted the inside of an old jail cell (for 'Gateway' ministry which is inside the old prison, with different ministries around different buildings).

Michelle emailed that she had "met lots of really inspiring people" and been "encouraged by meeting people who really understand what it means to love God and love others." Michelle and her friend Catherine have also had the opportunity to see some of the local wildlife and were planning to spend a few nights in a lodge near the mountains before heading back to Johannesburg

on 19th May and then travelling on to Zambia. Michelle had also enjoyed spending time with the children in the family with whom they were staying, visiting local communities and experiencing some of the local lifestyle and culture. Some parts have also been challenging for the girls.

Please continue to pray for Michelle (& Catherine) as they travel on into Zambia.

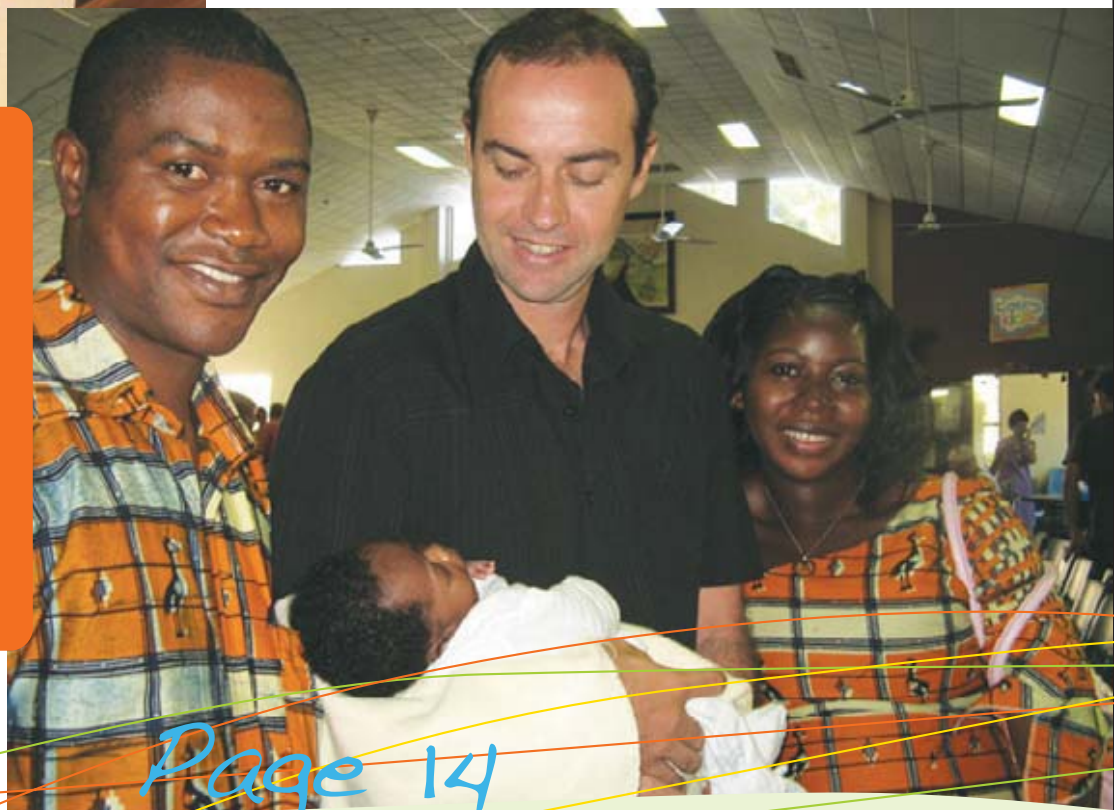

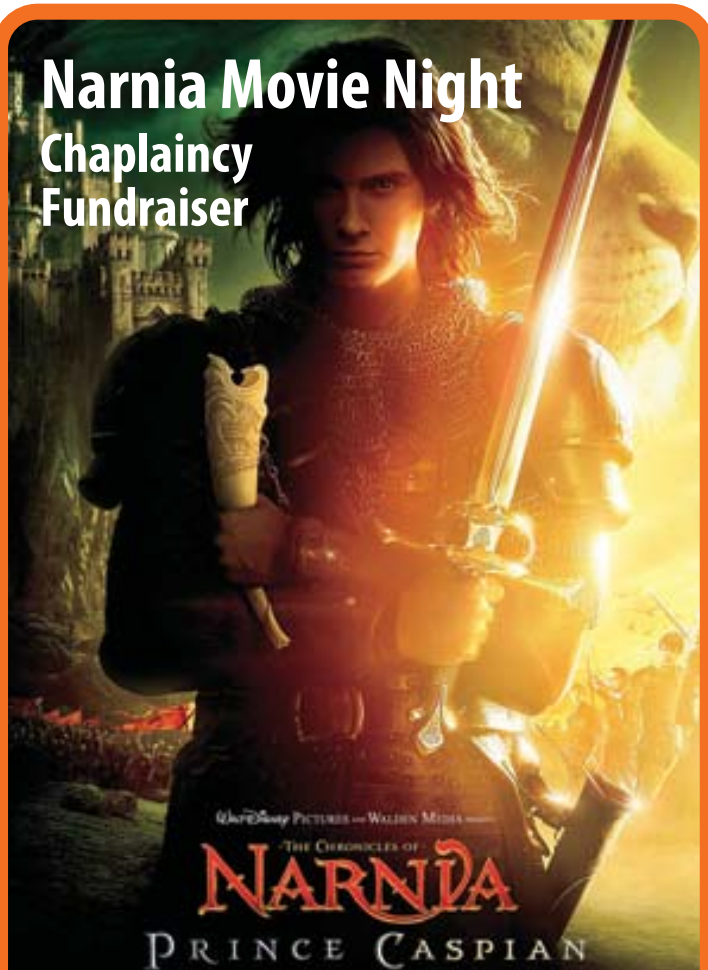
Faith ▶
