A personal note...

Power

from on high

Jules and I had a great time in PNG sharing with the MAF family at their annual conference. They are such wonderful people and each year we go, there is a new level of intimacy and power in which we can share. This year I shared with them some of the messages we have been looking at in recent weeks from Galatians. In particular I talked about the desire God has for us to be clothed with power so we can rise up with Him and fulfill our calling.

While Jules and I both love going over there, I must admit the thing I struggle with most is the flying. While I know there are more things that can go wrong when you are on the ground than when you are up

in the air, the consequences are much greater when you are up in the air!!

The same is true for our spiritual walk and that is why too many of us are content to walk with God when we could be flying with him. It's safer to walk, or so we think, and so we go through life operating in a base level in our relationship with God. For the security and safety of walking, we forgo being clothed with power from on high so that we might soar with God in the work and ministry He is doing in the world and our own neighbourhood.

For the kingdom of God is not a matter of talk but of power.

1 Co 4:20

“..But stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.” Luke 24:49

God makes it clear we are not even fit for ministry until we have been clothed with power from on high. Do you desire that for your own life? Are you prepared to do whatever is required so we can receive the power from on high?

If we want to soar with God we must also be prepared to do the ground work. Flying a plane is the end result of many hours spent on the ground preparing the plane to fly. For every hour in the air there are many more spent on the ground. In MAF PNG for instance there are 26 pilots and 124 ground staff!

The same is true for us as individuals and as a church.

If we want to soar with God and be clothed with power we must first do the ground work in prayer.

God has so much more for us. Let us not be content to walk when we can fly. Let's not be content with our own strength when we can have power from on high.

Can I encourage you church to seek God like never before. Seek to know Him. Seek to be filled with Him. May we together know and experience what Paul prayed for.

“... That you will understand the incredible greatness

of God's power for us who believe him. This is the same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead and seated him in the place of honor at God's right hand in the heavenly realms. Now he is far above any ruler or authority or power or leader or anything else—not only in this world but also in the world to come. God has put all things under the authority of Christ and has made him head over all things for the benefit of the church. And the church is his body; it is made full and complete by Christ, who fills all things everywhere with himself.” Eph 1:19-23

Community Life

What does Community Life really mean? What does living in community mean? As you know Phil and I have just come back from PNG and attending the MAF international staff conference – **RISE08**, there. There are dangers associated with living in PNG and especially in the major town centres such as Goroka and Mt Hagen, and as a result of this the staff at these bases live in compounds with maybe 5 houses encased within a barbed wire fence – this could be thought of as living in Community.

So what is it like??? For some it is a great experience of having someone nearby to talk to, connect with, and pray with etc, for others there can be tension when people don't get on quite as would be expected! God has made each of us individually with different personality traits, different likes and dislikes. Some of us are extroverts and would love to be mixing with other people, playing games etc, every night of the week, and some do. Some of us are introverts and crave time to be on our own and away from other

people! For others it can still be very lonely, knowing there is somebody just outside your door but not feeling confident or having the courage to let them know how you feel and that you need help or just simply, their company!

How do we find a good balance of community within a church where we don't live right next door to each other, we have different jobs, different likes and dislikes, different lives altogether. Is it important to have community with the rest of your church? If so, how do we do that, what does it look like?

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

“Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work. If one falls down, his friend can help him up. But pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up! Also, if two lie down together they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.”

One of the most encouraging things Phil and I saw during our time in PNG was watching the people at the conference ministering to each other. On our last night together we had communion. There are four families leaving MAF PNG within the next few months and these people served communion to the rest of the “MAF family” and prayed with each person or family as they came forward to take communion. There were lots of tears, lots of smiles, but most importantly lots of prayer, encouragement and support. This to me was the best aspect of community that I could witness. People loving one another, sharing the gift of life (communion), and sharing the gift of love that Christ has given us.

Yes, it is important to have community within our church, to love one another as Christ has loved you. To minister to one another as Christ wants us to.

Hello!

I love that quote above. Worship is not something we turn on or off, we continually worship something. Prayer on the Pyramid

Saturday morning – 6.45am at the base of Walsh's Pyramid at Gordonvale - not a spot where you find too many people at that time of day!

17 guys turned up to climb 993 vertical metres - up and down - and spend some time on the "summit" in prayer. It took us 2 hours to reach the top and about 1.75hrs to get back down. It turned out that at many

points on the way up and back the guys had spiritual moments and thoughts and prayers - thoughts of pilgrimage, heading for a goal not knowing what the journey brings; feelings of pain as soft muscles are being asked to perform harder than normal; prayers of worship of our God, as we saw a perspective of our city from above; prayer for strength and oxygen as the bodies began to weary.

Talking with one of the guys we considered the sovereign view God has on our lives as we watched cars driving along the highway past cane fields and houses. We know what has happened in our lives and what is happening right now but aren't always so sure about what will

happen, but God is sovereign over all things and knows the end from the beginning. As we looked down and saw the planning of cane farms and other properties we reflected on God's perspective on our lives and gave thanks that He has a plan for us that we don't always need to understand. We prayed for the city and for each other. It was an awesome day.

Most of us were reminded about the Pyramid for about a week after the day. Literally with each step...

Well the time has finally come when this month sees our Watoto Team head off (6th – 24th August) to Uganda to build the Watoto house. It has thus far been an exciting journey together since the concept was adopted by our church in February 2007!

Recent fundraising efforts have been so helpful – not only to the team and to the children in Uganda, but in building our own faith as we have seen God at work in our lives and through the hearts of others!

We will all look forward to the team sharing upon their return, but in the meantime a very **special thank you** must go to all of you who have very kindly contributed to this project in so many ways.

In addition to our fundraising efforts, the team have undergone a cultural training session over afternoon tea (hosted by our dear friend Samille), had a prayer sessions, have been meeting regularly for fellowship, and doing all the other necessary preparation including medicals, filling out forms, and packing!

Total fundraising efforts achieved \$5,145.65, which was equally shared between the 5 Cairns team members, with some members in a position to use their share of the funds to purchase items to take over for the children. These funds resulted from the 2nd hand clothing sale, 5 afternoon teas, an Asian food cook up (thanks again Yetwan!), personal donations including MIG, and the Edge Hill School Free Dress day.

Donations and items purchased for the children have included pyjamas, materials, tourniquets, educational charts, books, rulers, pens, rubbers and books.

As we send the team off with our blessings – Penny Grummitt, Peter Jetson, Margaret Chandler, Tim & Shell Hicken, and Rob Tyrrell (team leader) together with his crew of 10 from Beachside Christian Church, please continue to support them in prayer – pending their safe return and in anticipation of God being able to use them in ways beyond their expectations!
