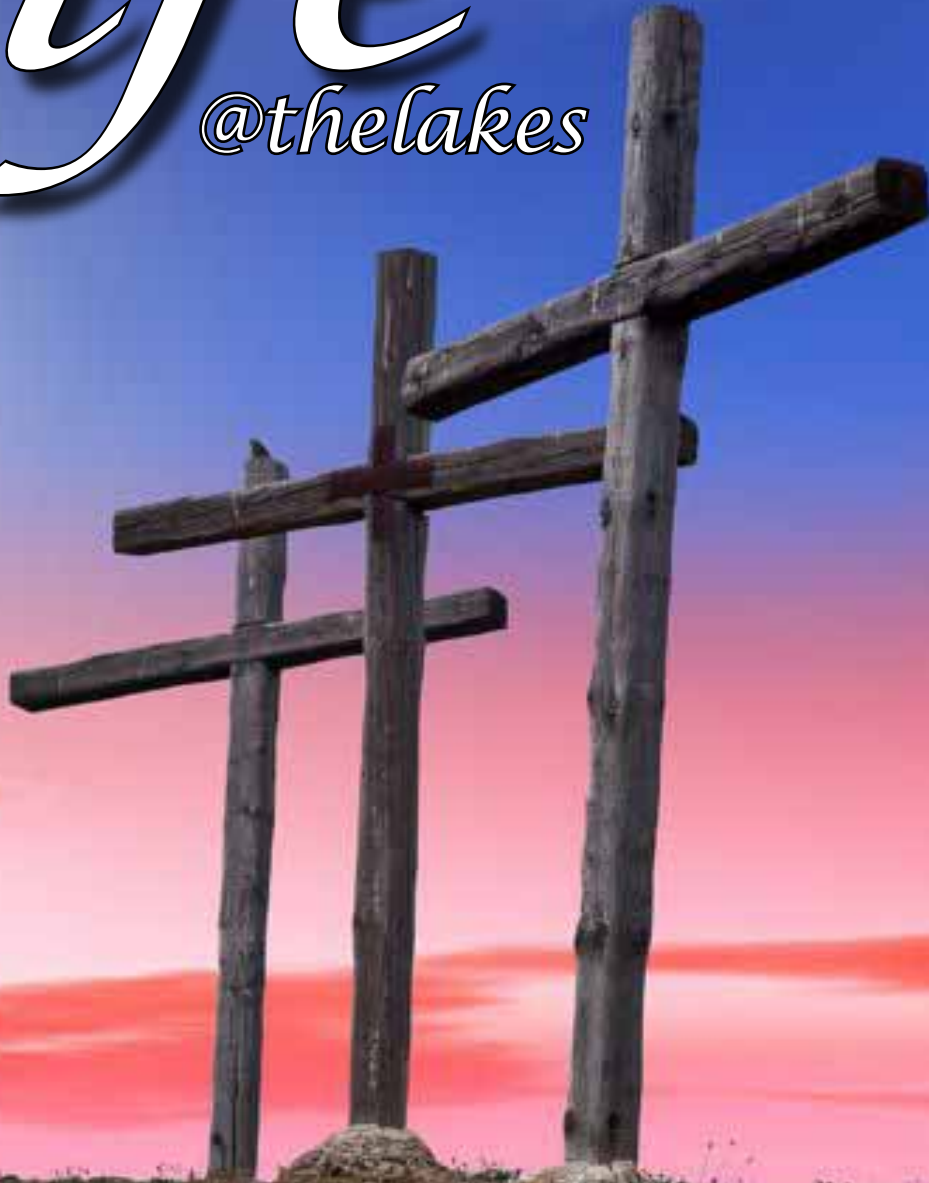

# Reflections on the cross



At around this time each year people think about the events that happened over two thousand years ago on a hill just outside Jerusalem. Easter is well regarded in Christian circles as the peak time of the year with the focus on the events of the crucifixion of the Creator of the Universe, the Lord Jesus Christ on a rough cross. In light of recent startling global events, it's challenging to ask if and how the crucifixion speaks to us? Jesus Christ's appearance on earth born into a Jewish family demonstrated that God is not distant to the events of human experience. In His life on the planet around the beginning of the First Century AD, He lived in Galilee, grew up in relative obscurity learning the skills of carpentry in a family in Nazareth before launching out at the age of thirty on His great quest of redeeming a lost humanity. He connected with us, the Emmanuel (God with us – Isa 7:14), foretold by the prophet Isaiah approximately 700 years before. As a man, Jesus experienced things that we experience. He ate, slept,

wept and walked the road of human life. He suffered hardship, observed people's pain and brought comfort, healing, truth and deliverance to many. He proclaimed in Luke 4:18-19:

'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because He has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' Not only does Jesus, the God-man connect with us (the human race), but His clear goal was to bring salvation, deliverance, freedom, healing and blessing to a lost and broken world. So the events culminating in the betrayal, trials, flogging and crucifixion of Jesus, God's sacrificial lamb, points to this amazing but perplexing salvation from the hand of God. Jesus suffered tremendously. He knew pain, and so He is familiar with ours. He suffered unjustly as well. He feels the heartbreak of children without parents, the anguish of grief, the pain of loneliness and the numbness of tragedy. Can we

really argue that God doesn't care about our plight? Is He really distant, leaving us to our own fate?

In Romans 8, the apostle Paul penned some powerful words. In verse 32 he wrote: "He who did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up for us all – how will he not also, along with Him, graciously give us all things? In verse 34 and 35 he continues, 'Christ Jesus, who died – more than that, who was raised to life – is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?'

The resounding answer from scripture is that none of these things (death, life, time, spiritual forces or anything from creation) are able to separate us from the love of God in Christ. He loves us, oh how He loves us. Connect with Him this Easter and drink deeply of His love and grace.

## Y-Zone



**H**i! I'm Ben Lucht! Beth has asked me to share some of my story with you so I hope you enjoy the read.

In 2008 my family and I moved to Cairns from a small town called Texas which is south of Brisbane. As Texas only had about 100 kids with our closest neighbours being 2.4 kilometres away I never had any close friends. Farm life was hard with not much rain and smaller crops than we wished for.

We moved into a house in Redlynch across from Walter and Marty Harnisch and around the corner from the Mollenhauers. I now see that this was God's way of caring for me! He obviously was keen for me to come to Him but in those days, my faith was weak and based on what I wanted God to be.

Walter was keen for me to attend Y-Zone so I began this journey in March 2008. This was my first exposure of kids who really loved God. I've seen some Y-Zoners faith grow and now

these youth are some of my best friends. It's been the greatest decision for me to attend Y-Zone!

After the Y-Zone camp in June 2010 I became regular with attending Church. Prior to that, my life was thrown upside down resulting in bad decisions which I regret. Many of my friendships were not healthy and I needed to learn how to assert for and respect myself. God intervened with the support of the Y-Zone leaders and my new friends - my life was saved by God! God helped me throughout this time - it was so obvious that He was in my life so it's great to now be living for Him! It's not always easy to live for God but it's worth it!

The relationship I have with God is by far the best thing in my life today! I take issues to God and He fixes them. My family are also important to me. My Mum comes to Church occasionally and my younger sister attends Y-Zone. My Dad and other sister are not yet interested in coming to Church but I continue to

invite them. The support I've received from Y-Zone is fantastic! The friendships and support from the leaders are so important to me. I appreciate being able to hang out with my 'Church friends' over lunch on Sundays, drop into leaders homes and be a part of their families. These relationships provide me with great support and love.

The best thing about God for me is that He gives hope. Hope is the reason why we do everything. We are able to hope that things will get better even if things feel like they are getting worse first. **1 Corinthians 13 v 13 says 'For now there are Faith, Hope and Love. But of these three, the greatest is Love.'** I pray that in the future, my life explodes with Gods love both to me and from me. God has given us all the strength to love one another and it is my prayer that everyone feels Gods love and worships Him.

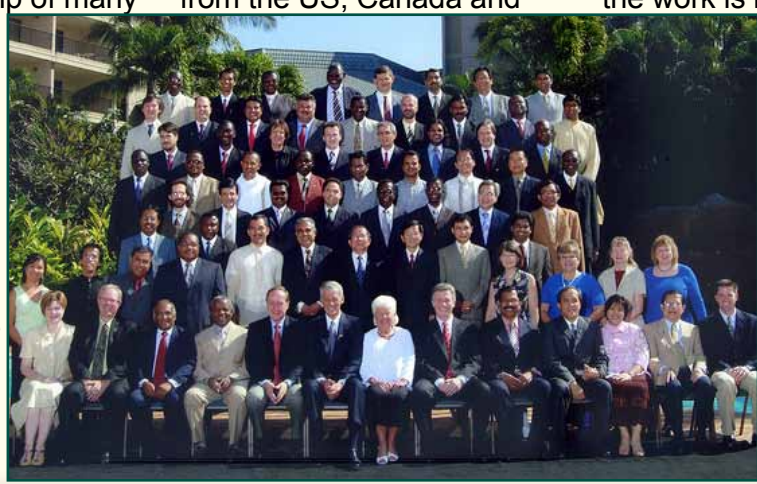
